NEW PALESTINE – Edna L. Krug, age 92, of New Palestine, passed from this life to her heavenly home on September 15, 2010. She was born in New Haven, Indiana, to August and Anna Bremer. She was a fun and loving mother and grandmother to six grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren; sixteen step-grandchildren; and numerous step-great-grandchildren.

Edna worked many years for L.S. Ayres in the downtown store. She was a beautiful seamstress and an avid gardener and cook. She was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Indianapolis where she was involved in numerous organizations.
