GREENFIELD – Randy Lee Frazier, age 51, of Greenfield, passed away Sunday, April 27, 2014 at St. Vincent Hospice. He was born on September 13, 1962 in Greenfield as the son of Jack Phillip and Judy Ann (Breece) Frazier. He graduated from Greenfield-Central High School in 1980.
